What is the DTES Bagged Lunch Project?

The Downtown Eastside Bagged lunch project started is a way to give back to the community. We started out in 2015 with 2 sandwich makers and 1 cookie maker. All lunches were served in paper bags decorated by Hawthorne students.

Each year the project as grown in size, both number of lunches served and items available. Last year more than 500 lunches containing a sandwich, banana, pop and Halloween candy were served. Hand knit hats, scarves, socks, toothbrushes and toothpaste, feminine hygiene products and pet food were also available. As of today, a total of over 2000 lunches have been provided - all in beautifully decorated bags by the students of Hawthorne!

This year, because of COVID-19, we are not able to continue the tradition of providing lunches. As such, we have decided to concentrate of items needed by the Union Gospel Mission's outreach program - hats, scarves, socks, mittens and gloves.

We are hoping to be able to provide a large amount of these important warm winter items to as many people in need as possible. Please send new, adult-sized socks, mittens or gloves to your child's class **before November 30th**. These items will be collected from the school by the organizers and delivered to the Union Gospel Mission later that week.
