PRINICPAL'S MESSAGE Dear Parents/Guardians:

I can't believe we are in June already. People often ask if we are 'winding down' now that June is here. On the contrary, my experience is that schools get 'wound up'. June is a month of transitions for many. It is a busy time of year for teachers as they begin to do final reports and start to make plans for next year in terms of preparing the classes for September. For parents, there is the joy at the prospect of having their kids home all summer with them for some quality time together, coupled with the realization that they have to have their kids home ALL summer with them! For students, there is excitement that summer holidays are coming and bringing with it the promise of warm weather and being with friends outside. There is also a lot of worry that can go with it; for some school is a place of predictability and comfort and being away from it can be worrisome. They may also start to wonder about the unknown; Who will my teacher be next year? Will friends be in my class? What am I going to do all day for the summer? Please take time over the last couple weeks of school to reassure kids that they have the skills necessary to transition from school to summer and back again. Review with your kids all the growth and learning they have done and find ways to remind them to reframe their thinking in a positive way. Remind them that they already adjusted very well to the new routines and expectations this year brought with it which will make next year seem that much easier.

Kamloops Residential School Response

Many of you are aware of the tragic discovery at the site of the Kamloops Residential School over the last week. This is a reminder of the ongoing importance of the work schools do to help educate our population about the destructive history of residential schools and government policies such as the Indian Act, as well as the damage they have caused so many families. Our intention as a school is to continue to bring awareness to the impact of residential schools in general, as well as address this particular case in an age-appropriate and respectful manner. Our plan for a school-wide recognition will be for all staff and students to wear orange shirts on Wednesday, June 2. We are also creating a banner to bring awareness to the 215 children who are known to have lost their lives at the Kamloops site as well as the many thousands of other children throughout Canada who are not accounted for. It will be on display starting Wednesday.

COVID Update

There has been lots of good news on the COVID front as the province has unveiled a proposal for a gradual reopening of the province. Most of the changes will have more of an impact on next school year rather than the rest of this one. We will continue with the same practices to ensure safety and so we don't cause any setbacks that may delay our return to normal. Here's what we know at present:

- All K-12 schools remain in the current Stage 2 through to June 30th and into Summer programming. Our current safety plan remains in place until September (or further notice). Summer programs will be operated under the current safety plan.
- School Districts will receive detailed planning guidelines for school opening before June 30th. At present, we are planning for a Stage 1 (regular) start in September with no cohorts/learning groups.
- Guidelines for Graduation/year end Ceremonies are in place and will not be changed before the end of the year.
- All year end plans for any celebrations or events at school fall under the current health and safety guidelines for K-12.

We have noticed a reduction in the number of vehicles being counted by our student crosswalk guards with the reopening of the Hawthorne Park parking lot and pathways, as well as the access from Grove Avenue. One important reminder is to be very cautious when crossing from the parent/visitor parking to the school. We have had a couple of close calls where kids have bolted into traffic without looking. Please keep young kids close and try to use the crosswalk or central path across the traffic circle 'island'. This way it is more predictable for drivers as they come to the school. As always, we encourage as many people as possible to walk regardless of the weather, but the sunny days ahead will make it that much nicer to do.

We will continue to put the lost and found items out the front of the school. Any unclaimed items will be donated before the last day of school. We tend to see an increase in the number of lost items as the weather gets better because kids wear hoodies and jackets out to play, get too hot, and dump them on the ground where they are forgotten.
